KEY DIFFERENCES AT A GLANCE

eSignatures



eSignatures are used to **show** intent to sign a document with a binding signature.

Digital Signatures



Digital signatures are used to secure a document.

eSignatures are an electronic representation of your wet-inked signature, while digital signatures use personal information like an email address or date of birth to verify you and create a signature.

THE DIFFERENCE IS IN THE DETAILS



eSignatures are used to...

- Show intent to sign
- Gain visibility into who has signed
- Collect legally-binding signatures



Digital signatures are used to...

- Secure important documents using encryption
- Validate user identity using authentication methods
- Tamper-proof documents and avoid changes after signing



- Gain higher visibility with audit trails with timestamps and digital certificates
- Stay in compliance, satisfying UETA, SOC2, HIPAA, and more
